SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I believe it takes 25. We'll check here in a minute. Okay, we're checking this out with the legal people up here. In the mean time, there has been a motion to go under call. The question is, shall the house go under call? If we do go under call, we'll be checking this out. All those in favor of going under call please vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. Please return to your desks. Thank you. In regard to what it takes to kill the bill, we have two legal minds up here and there was a discussion. But the one that says it takes a simple majority to kill the bill on General File prevails. Did you want a roll call vote?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Let's have a roll call vote in reverse order, please, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. The question is...we're looking for Senator Chambers. I thought we were all here, but we have one. The question is, shall the bill be indefinitely postponed?
