Withem. Senator John DeCamp, record your presence, please. Senator DeCamp. Now we're looking for Senator Landis, and he is here. All here. The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor...we've asked for...okay. Senator Johnson, did you want a roll call, or did you want call in votes on the advancement? Pardon me?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Let's just do a roll call vote.

Would you folks please stand and be welcomed by the Legislature. Thank you. Would you please return to your seats now. We are ready for Final Reading.
