Lowell Johnson. Senator Landis, would you poke your green button, please. Thank you. Senator Lowell Johnson. We are still short. We are short Senator Lowell Johnson, Senator Rod Johnson. Do you want to proceed with the roll call?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Proceed.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Roll call vote has been requested and request has also been asked for reverse order. Mr. Clerk, would you call the roll in reverse order, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2167-68 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The motion fails and the bill is not returned. Do we have anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, I have a priority motion from Senator Rod Johnson to bracket the bill until Monday, April 14th.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Is there any objection to bracketing LB 603 till Monday? There is. Do you want to move, Senator Johnson, then?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Yes, sir, I do.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, any discussion on the...Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Johnson a question if he will yield.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Johnson, will you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Johnson, what is the motivation for bracketing the bill till Monday?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Well, to be honest with you, Senator, it gives me time to try and solicit some votes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Johnson is very honest, as I knew he would be, and his honesty is the reason for us to go ahead and read the bill. The Legislature has taken the vote, the amendment was not...I meant the bill was not returned for the amendment and I think we ought to go ahead and read the bill.
