I would hope that if he believes that is in the best interests of the state, he would follow his conscience, his wisdom, his good agriculture background...

SENATOR LAMB: Okay. Okay.

SENATOR DECAMP: ...and do that very thing.

SENATOR LAMB: Okay.

SENATOR DECAMP: That means, yeah.

SENATOR LAMB: One more question, Senator Vickers was questioning you about the counties having the ability to...computer ability to handle this. Some of the counties don't have that ability. Is that correct?

SENATOR DECAMP: It is my understanding that is not correct. They all have that terminal now and the system was turned over with the understanding the terminal is, in fact, in place, that every single county, whether it be 600 people or 600,000 is now part of that system and all tuned in. It is a done deed.

SENATOR LAMB: Okay, thank you. I guess in consideration of the fact that Senator DeCamp doesn't think this amendment is completely essential to the bill and that the bill has been examined by the Banking Committee in depth and I am sure they have been thorough in doing their work up to this point, I would suggest that we not adopt the amendment and just read the bill and let's get on with the end of the session.
