Doesn't have to check with 93 county clerks, just finds out from the Secretary of State. Simple as that. I would ask that the bill be returned for the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is, shall LB 603 be returned to Select File for a specific amendment? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Thirty seconds. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The bill is returned. Now, Senator Johnson, do you want to speak to your amendment?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I do want to clarify for the record one thing, since I simply took the Rod Johnson amendment and struck the emergency clause, according to Senator DeCamp I inadvertently struck that last amendment that we just put on on Select File. That was totally inadvertent and for E & R, they are to please understand and they are to hear me as I speak that that was not intended and, in fact, that last amendment that we adopted shall remain adopted. It is simply an interpretational issue, I am sure. The amendment is one we have discussed already. I don't want to discuss it anymore. If you wish to discuss it, you can. I would ask you to adopt it. It truly...I swear to goodness, you do this amendment and you are entitled to say to yourself that this state deserves a good housekeeping seal of approval in terms of a central filing system under the Uniform Commercial Code.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Nelson, on the Vard Johnson amendment, please. Senator Chambers.
