

last speaker, Senator Hoagland, so I am assuming we won't need to do that. Senator Johnson, would you like to close on your amendment then?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes. Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I would just like to make two points. If I have made a slight mistake in this amendment, if I have inadvertently repealed the work we just did, I will offer another amendment as soon as this is readvanced to take care of that problem. I apologize for that. Haste sometimes does make waste. Secondly, and this is for Senator Nelson as well as for the rest of the Legislature, nobody talked to me about this issue. I have been sitting very quietly in my chair all morning. I have known what is right to do, what is right in my heart. I have voted this way. I truly believe in it. I am sure that you do too as you appreciate the importance to our state of a really up-to-date modernized system of dealing with creditor-debtor transactions. We can take a lot of pride, a lot of pride in what we have and it is important to get it certified and it is important to get it in the best of shape and that is exactly what this amendment does. I would now offer the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is the adoption of the Johnson amendment to LE 603. All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? You have 15 more seconds. Have you all voted? Three more seconds. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.
