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establish a \$6,000 Cash Fund and this would be for the commission to print rules and regs and charge for it and then they would be able to use this Cash Fund. So I move the adoption of this amendment to the E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Pappas, do you wish to speak on this amendment?

SENATOR PAPPAS: Yes. Could I ask Senator Hefner some questions, please?

PRESIDENT: Yes. May we have quiet in the Chamber, please, so that we may (gavel) hear this interchange.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Senator Hefner, is there any particular reasons why you didn't publish these amendments or get them to people earlier?

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes, there is, Senator Pappas. We just finished drafting them over the noon hour.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Okay. Could you tell me why do you lengthen the days from, I think, 45 to 60?

SENATOR HEFNER: Excuse me, what was that question?

SENATOR PAPPAS: Part of your amendment was to strike 45 and insert 60 days. Why?

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes. The Liquor Control Commission requested this and, as I said earlier, we changed the local governing body's number of days from 30 to 45 and now we only think it's fair that we give the Liquor Control Commission a few more days so we struck 45 and put 60 days which would give them 15 more days.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Okay, your main part of the amendment then, the Section 7, where it talks local governing body, the city, village, county shall adopt licensing standards by ordinance and may enact licensing standards which are more restrictive than the Nebraska Liquor Control Act, would this allow political subdivisions to even control the hours of operations of the different liquor establishments?

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Pappas, I don't believe that this here amendment would, no.
