SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, this is the amendment that I offered on the E & R amendment. I think I explained it fully. If you have any questions, I would be happy to answer any questions for you. So I move for the adoption of this amendment.

Now, as I understand it, Section 53.116 of the Liquor Control Commission enabling legislation, gives the Commission exclusive power to control all phases of the control of liquor in the state. I've got the section right here and it says that the power to regulate all phases of the control of the manufacture, distribution, sale and traffic in liquors is hereby vested exclusively in the commission. And, as I understand it, there is no effort to amend any of that language in Section 53.116 even though the bill is clearly inconsistent with that existing language and I wonder if you would want to,
