

After Senator Vickers, I have these members for recognition. Senators Chambers, DeCamp and Higgins.

SENATOR VICKERS: Well, Mr. President, as Senator Haberman pointed out, it probably is in the eyes of the beholder, but as somebody that spends an awful lot of time on the interstate, I want to thank Senator Chambers for the ten miles he has given me and would certainly support him in his efforts to be prepared in case the...just in case the federal government does change the rules of the road. I think it would be ridiculous if the federal government changed the rules of the road and we were still in a position where we couldn't change ours. So I certainly will support Senator Chambers and, you know, would just like to add one other thing, that under this type of government we have in this society we do those things that the majority of the people want to do anyhow. If you spend any time out there, then it's pretty evident that they want the speed limit to be a little faster anyway, so I would certainly support Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT: Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I'd call the question, Mr. President.
