and adopted by the body in 1980 the last time we discussed this issue. As I understand it, Senator Chambers has no objection to that amendment. You should have a copy of it on your desk. I'd ask its adoption. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I do agree with the amendment. It is a very reasonable and proper one for the reasons that Senator Hoagland gave and I believe the federal legislation, as it was explained to our office, would allow metropolitan areas this type of leeway, so by putting it in this bill we will again be tracking that legislation, so I support it.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp. Senator DeCamp, do you wish to speak?

SENATOR DECAMP: I was going to call the question.

PRESIDENT: Okay, thank you for your motion. I think it's not needed. There are no other lights on. Senator Hoagland, do you have any closing? The motion is the adoption of the Hoagland amendment that has just been under discussion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Hoagland's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely, I assume, Senator, this is an amendment...okay, Senator Wesely would move to amend, Mr. President. (Wesely amendment appears on page 2180 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. President, members, again, hopefully, Senator Chambers will agree to this, maybe he won't, but the big concern is trying to enact a repealer by January 15th if we don't see action taken by the Congress, and Senator Hoagland and I have co-signed an amendment to change the date. This would take effect from January 15th to September 15th. That way we can act next session to pass
