

Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Well, Mr. President, Senator Hoagland has already said what I would agree with and that is with or without the emergency clause it would make no sense to come back and change it with 25 votes and then have six, seven months at one speed level. I don't know how much you would spend changing signs back and forth but it would be substantial, and books, drivers' examination books, I don't know what all. So at least, at least put an effective date that can be worked with within the realm of possibilities next session. It would be a better idea after you adopted this to kill the bill, of course.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, you may close.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. No, this is a sincere, good faith effort to again recognize the different problems with this amendment that you have of Senator Chambers, that you have adopted. If you don't take this step, as Senator Warner just said, you have got the signs you have got to change, the books you have got to change. You have got the threat of federal sanctions by doing this. If you want to send a message to Washington, by delaying the date that message will still be sent but you don't box yourself in, you don't give yourself no out, and I think you want to do that. I think you want to give yourselves some time to think about this, if we don't have the things fall in place you want to have in place, so I would ask your support for the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion is the adoption of the Wesely amendment under discussion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote aye or nay. Please record your vote aye or nay on the Wesely amendment to 600A which has been under discussion. Twenty seconds to record your vote. You are asked to record your vote on this amendment if you wish to, aye or nay. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Could we have a call of the house, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Maybe. A call of the house is requested, and the question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.
