PRESIDENT: All right, do you wish to proceed with the roll call without Senators Peterson and Sieck? Do you wish to proceed, Senator. I can't see you, Senator Conway. The Clerk will call the roll and may we have quiet in the Chamber, please, so the Clerk may hear your (gavel) vote. Call the roll, aye or nay, the Conway amendment.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2191-92 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment fails. What else on the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend the bill.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit. The call of the house is raised.

CLERK: Senator, I have two amendments from you. The one I have in front of me now is AM3009. (The Schmit amendment appears on page 2192 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR SCHMIT: That is right. We will take that one first.

PRESIDENT: Go ahead, Senator.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members, the amendment which you have before you, 3009, is an amendment which allows the department to contract for inspection service for the purpose of affirming the fact that we do have a clean shipment of grain as provided for on the amendment we adopted here a few days ago. I move adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rod Johnson.
