

more than \$10 a bushel. How much longer do you want it to build up? I am saying it is time we do those things we can do by ourself for ourself at our own expense, no taxpayer expense involved. I move the adoption of the amendment and the subsequent amendment, and I hope that you will not be misled by thinking that this is any kind of public expense. It is not. It is a personal expense incurred by an individual who says, I want to demonstrate that I have a better quality product, just as you advertise high-quality pork, high-quality beef, high-quality poultry, high-quality eggs, any other product. It is a superior product. We attest to it and we expect to be able to encourage people to buy it from us. I move the adoption of my amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion is the adoption of the Schmit amendment to LB 1007. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. May we have the attention of the Legislature, please, attention of all members to the motion before us, and that is an amendment by Senator Schmit to 1007. Please record your vote aye or nay. We need the cooperation of the membership to record your aye or nay votes on these motions so that we may proceed as fast as possible on this crucial day of the Legislature. Please record your vote. Please record your vote aye or nay on Senator Schmit's motion to amend LB 1007. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Schmit's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Do you wish to readvance...go ahead.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend the bill. (The second Schmit amendment appears on page 2193 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Another amendment, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, this amendment as I said earlier creates the cash fund and I move the adoption of the amendment. No cost to the state. I would like to say one more thing while I am at it. We have a number of checkoff boards trying to encourage the production, distribution, and sale of quality product. They are limited to a certain extent by grain standards. Once we have done this, why don't we allow those individuals who want to do so to set up a higher standard,
