PRESIDENT: Very well. Now then the order now is to go to LR 16, LR 16CA. And after that we will go to Final Reading, Senator Warner's override motion to be taken up after Final Reading.

CLERK: Mr. President, on LR 16 the first item I have on the resolution is a motion to unbracket it from Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: I'll ask to have it unbracketed.

PRESIDENT: There is an unanimous consent request to unbracket the resolution. Is there objection? There is objection.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, I'll move.

PRESIDENT: Now there is a motion to unbracket.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, I'll move to unbracket.

PRESIDENT: You've just moved. Now do you want to speak on that motion?

SENATOR DECAMP: Very briefly. Senator Lundy has a proposal. This is a vehicle, I said he could use it. I think he ought to be afforded the chance and that's all I'm trying to do with this proposal.

PRESIDENT: Okay, Senator Wesely, do you wish to speak? We are on a 30-minute total time scale for this matter, members.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Aside from the merits of the issue, and we should talk about that, I'd like to talk first about procedure. Mr. President, members, before you is a motion to unbracket LR 16CA. This motion, this LR is notorious across the State of Nebraska. LR 16 has been written about, it's been talked about, it's been debated and discussed and it is identified as the Initiative 300 repealer constitutional amendment. And certainly even having it up in front of us is going to have some people concerned across the state who felt like this resolution had finally been put to rest permanently. Now it's being resurrected, but no longer to deal with the issue of Initiative 300, in fact, to deal with the question of a constitutional amendment dealing with the right to bear arms.
