PRESIDENT: Very well, the motion is the adoption of the resolution 16CA. All those in favor...motion is to unbracket it. Thank you. The motion is to unbracket the motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. A simple majority will prevail because the motion was made by the prime introducer. Please record your vote on the motion to unbracket. Have you all voted? I would invite the attendance of other members if you wish to come in and vote on this measure. Have you all voted? The motion is to unbracket LR 16CA. Please record your vote. I see some members taking their seats. I will give you the opportunity to press your aye or nay button. Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 2194-95 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 10 nays to unbracket the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: There is 13 minutes left of the half hour.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a series of amendments to the bill. Mr. President, the first, Senator Conway, you had amendments pending. Senator, you want to withdraw yours. Okay. Mr. President, I have a motion pending from Senator Chambers to indefinitely postpone the resolution.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, this LR 16CA, as it sits now, is to repeal Initiative 300. This amendment is not going to be adopted. It is going to be stopped. Then we have before us LR 16CA in what could be called its pristine purity, meaning the original form in which it was introduced, except that it has slid through through a gray, slithered through the slime, and emerged from the primordial ooze, to quote Senator Landis. This is not a good proposition whether it is in the form that it exists now or the one that Senator Lundy is trying to put it in. What we need to do is kill this proposition once and for all, and my amendment would
