

PRESIDENT: The motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp has an amendment to the resolution.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: No, no, I want to let Senator Lundy get to his amendment if there is any time.

PRESIDENT: About two minutes left.

CLERK: The next motion I have is by Senators DeCamp, Conway, and Scofield. Then I have an amendment from Senator Vickers. I had a note you want to withdraw, Senator. Mr. President, I now have a motion from Senator Lundy. Senator Lundy would move to suspend Rule 7, Section 3(d) to permit consideration of AM2974. The amendment is signed by Senators Lundy, Hefner, Chronister, Sieck, Lamb, Rupp and Pappas.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lundy. Senator, the call of the house is raised. Thank you. Senator Lundy. One minute left.

SENATOR LUNDY: I think that everything has been said that needs to be said. I would say let's get along with the business at hand and proceed.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rupp.

SENATOR RUPP: Well, real briefly to answer Senator Chambers, that question was asked in the committee about the things that he described and Mr. Lattanzio said that is covered by intent. There is no intent whatsoever to circumvent in any way state regulations, laws, or rules, anything that are already in place. I would just urge you to advance this amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers. There is a half a minute left for debate.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I am going to be the villain in this. The Constitution does have a meaning, and whoever this gentleman is that Senator Rupp quoted, he is not the arbiter of this Nebraska Constitution. The State Supreme Court makes that determination and I don't care what people intend, the words of the Constitution are there and they say what they say, and they mean what they mean, and no state law or political subdivision
