SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to overrule the Speaker's agenda and proceed to take up the items in the order that they appear on the green sheets that you find on your desks.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Schmit, please.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members, I visited earlier with the Speaker this morning about his changing the order. And I have some deep concern about the fact that if we do not take the motions up until after Final Reading as to whether or not those bills, if they are amended by motion, will be able to be in fact returned engrossed in time to be on our desk for one final day. And I do have that concern, although I guess at this point in time I'm going to adhere to the Speaker's wishes and withdraw my motion and hope that we just continue to work as expeditiously and rapidly as possible so that we do get to those motions. Certainly if we can act in that manner, perhaps we can get to most of them anyway. So, Mr. Speaker, Mr. President, I ask permission to withdraw my motion.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Schmit, I appreciate that. With that, if we go along, as I have suggested earlier, we can get to these. One other thing I should mention, for example, at the top of the second column you will notice 835. I believe that Senator Schmit wants to do something with that bill. But it is not of the nature that we need to talk all afternoon or all evening on it. If someone has the idea of thwarting that bill and all the rest behind it, I strongly urge you not to play that kind of politics today. It's too late. Maybe one of your bills after that you would like to get to, too. So when we do get to these amendments let's roll along with them as fast as we can. With that, Mr. Clerk, let's go to the Final Reading. We will be reading Final Reading this morning of those bills that do not have motions pending. If you can remove amendments, we can read that bill today. Okay, thank you. Mr. Clerk. Please return to your seats so that we can begin Final Reading. Ladies and gentlemen, please return to your seats. Please return to your seats, please. Thank you. We are all there except one. Okay, Mr. Clerk.
