I have received from the Appropriations Committee, and signed by its Chair, a report required pursuant to Rule 6, Section 14 regarding the Appropriations Committee review of the Governor's line-item vetoes of LB 1251 and 1252. And pursuant to that review the Appropriations Committee has filed a number of line-item veto overrides that will be considered later this afternoon by the Legislature, Mr. President. That is all that I have.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, then...okay, Mr. Clerk, would you read for us then the first item on the agenda for the override, as I understand it.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first motion I have with respect to the override of the Governor's line-item vetoes is the report and motion offered by the Appropriations Committee. Senator, this is motion number 1 that involves...well, 15 different sections of the mainline appropriations bill. SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Warner, are you ready and time now to take up your Appropriations Committee motion?
