

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The house is under call. Will all members at your stations please record your presence here on the green board at the front of the Legislative Chamber. Members outside the Chamber are requested to return to the floor of the Legislature, the house is under call. Senator Labeledz, please, record your presence. Senator Chambers, would you record your presence. Senator Baack, Senator Peterson. Senator Baack, please report to the Chamber, the house is under call. We are waiting for Senator Baack to return to the floor. Senator Baack is here. All right, may we have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) Roll call vote has been requested on the motion to override the veto of the line-item concerning technical community colleges. Please record your vote aye or nay when the Clerk calls your name.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2286 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 14 nays, Mr. President, on the override.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries, the veto is overridden.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is offered by the Appropriations Committee and signed by its members. (Gavel.) It relates to the specific funding for the Metropolitan Transit Authority bus purchase and small watersheds. (See page 2287 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature...

In the case of the Metro buses, as we indicated on General File, and I believe again on Select File, is a somewhat unique situation. You will recall that there are federal funds that are currently available in the case of Metro in which they could then utilize 800,000 of matching to replace the other half of their fleet.
