

will just ask them for...thank you for the motion, and Senator Warner, to close on the small watershed appropriation line-item.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I think it has been amply pointed out on this specific project and later during the course of today, assuming time permits, many of the comments that were made by Senator Schmit which are far-ranging in terms of what has occurred to water and conservation policy can be addressed but this specific issue is unique and the merit is such that I think it should be overridden.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the line-item veto concerning the small watershed appropriation of \$200,000 be overridden? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Please record your vote on the small watershed proposition, shall it be overridden? Aye or nay. The Chair will allow 30 seconds for the recording of your votes. Please record your vote on the veto...the motion to override the veto on the small watershed. Please record your vote aye or nay. Fifteen seconds to record your vote. Five seconds. Time. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would ask for the vote to be recorded.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2288 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 12 nays on the motion to override that portion of the veto relating to watershed projects, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The veto is overridden.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by the Appropriations Committee. It concerns funding for mental retardation aid as well as monies for the advocacy commissions.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner. May we have a little (gavel) less noise and more quiet, please. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I move adoption of the motion. To give you some background again as to the discussion in the committee on these particular
