I am proud to be able to support agencies which work hard and wisely spend dollars utilizing volunteers, utilizing services not just for the persons of one race or one gender but providing services or giving directions to those who are in need of assistance. Volunteers in all parts of our state help multiply the good product from the dollars which are provided by state dollars. In some instances these are used to match federal dollars or to augment volunteer dollars. Businesses are willing to make a contribution where the state has already made a commitment but to ask all of it to be volunteer dollars as well as volunteer hours is not a realistic expectation. It needs to be a joint project and I urge your adoption of the override on this item of our budget. Thank you very much.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2290-91 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to override.
