

housed in the Department of Roads that deals with railroad planning. It has been there in that agency for a number of years. It is funded with a minor amount of General Fund money. It is part of...the funds that are there now are for the purpose of updating a federally required transportation, railroad transportation plan, and that is all it has anything to do with. It has absolutely nothing to do with the highway program. It has absolutely nothing to do with the Highway Trust Fund. It has absolutely nothing to do with that share of money that the counties and cities, as well as the state, receives from highway user fees. And I appreciate, I suspect I appreciate what is attempting to be made a point of but it is not even apples and oranges. It is far more farther apart than that. It so happens that that particular activity is funded through that agency. That is all it is. There is a smaller one that we could consider that might be of equal importance. That is \$60 and that is Branch Rail Revitalization Committee which was enacted some years ago but I would urge that there is no need under any of the categories that we have addressed to this point for this override and that it not be done.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, and then the speaking order is as follows is Senator Harris, Schmit, Hall, Vard Johnson, DeCamp, Labedz, and Scofield.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, we often deal in symbolism and that is what is being done here now, and I think it is a good motion that Senator Hall made. This is the stuff of Congressional Medals of Honor really. Now they can vote against this override motion and say they voted against the Department of Roads, voted against restoring some money to them, then go away feeling like a hero. Like the heroes who invaded Grenada, America has a way of doing that. They are tough against the weak and cowardly against the strong. Then they...right, you are right, Senator Lamb. Here we go. Invaded Grenada, a tiny little island and gave out more medals for heroism than there were participants in the battle, as they called it. A couple of American helicopters crashed into each other and produced casualties. Some SEALS were trying to swim ashore, the water was high and they drowned, more casualties. Now American in the Rambo style which is being practiced by the Legislature in attacking the little helpless commissions is considering whether or not they ought to send two battle groups to attack Libya. Why? They say Libya is the home of terrorism. Yet according to America's State Department, there are three countries far more dangerous when it comes to that than Libya.
