PRESIDENT: Very well, Senator Hall. A roll call vote has been requested and the Clerk will call the roll. May we have order and quiet in the Chamber so the Clerk may hear your vote, please. Request for reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2296-97 of the Legislative Journal.) 10 ayes, 30 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have...

PRESIDENT: The call of the house is raised.

CLERK: ...is by Senator DeCamp and Senator DeCamp would move to suspend Rule 6, Section 11 and direct the Clerk to deliver LB 1251 to the Secretary of State.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I just thought we have done our vetoes, it appears that we are moved over into the realm of maybe the less likely to succeed vetoes and I just wonder if maybe if we lock in place this figure we pretty well know what we have spent, how much we have got to raise with the next bill along which is going to be, I suspect, the tax increase on sales tax. It was just a thought that maybe it would be time to quit now and get this bill over and...that locks it in rock or whatever. So it is just a suggestion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, do you wish to speak on the DeCamp motion?

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President and members, I would rise in opposition. I realize that it is a late hour and we have much to do. I'm not sure that we need to continue on the budget overrides at this point. I think Senator DeCamp is right in that respect, probably most of what we are going to do has been done, but at the same time perhaps if we could break from this point and go to the tax bills and advance those, I don't think we have to set in granite the situation, I think perhaps in the next day or two as we look at what we did not do, the other cuts that are in the vetoes, we may find in fact that we missed something or perhaps other attention needs to be paid to certain areas. I don't want to lose that opportunity. I don't see any reason why we can't move forward and leave behind the budget at this point
