

and work on other bills that we have to get done because veto overrides can occur anytime the next couple of days. Why put ourselves off in the corner and lock that door and not allow us the chance, if we find something that we made a mistake on, the chance to come back and correct it. As I said earlier with Senator Warner's cut list, if you will look at it there are some big cuts that we are looking at and I'm not sure people have been able to react to them, that we are not really sure exactly what impacts are there and why not give us the chance as we look at it over the next day or two that we may want to come back on an item or two and deal with problems that we have identified. So I'm asking you not to give up the chance to deal with this issue. I'd rather see it set aside for the rest of the day and move on to the other issues that have to be dealt with. We don't have to deal with overrides any longer and let's deal with it that way, not in this fashion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, when the rule was adopted that would allow the budget committee to go forward with its suggested overrides the intent was not to foreclose others from having the opportunity on an individual basis to seek overrides of specific items that the budget committee may not have seen fit to consider. So I think it would be improper, not even in harmony with the spirit or intent of that rule, to do what Senator DeCamp is suggesting now. I hope that his motion is voted down and as Senator Wesely pointed out, the bill's remaining here, and by bill's, I meant that with apostrophes, LB 1251's remaining here with us is not going to hinder any of the operations or activity of government and we can deal with those other items that Senator Wesely talked about and even others that he did not mention. So I'm opposed to Senator DeCamp's motion. I would like to ask him a question or two.

PRESIDENT: Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm going to ask him a question if I may. Senator John the Shepherd.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is there any reason other than just trying to get us off consideration of overrides, at this point, that you are making your motion?
