

But even though that unfairness is water under the bridge, polluted water under the sagging bridge of morality in the Legislature, I don't see any reason to make it worse by adopting Senator DeCamp's motion so I hope you will vote against it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Mr. President and colleagues, I rise to support Senator DeCamp's motion. I haven't particularly cared for the overrides, I haven't voted to make any overrides of the vetoes of the Governor and I think it is time we do move on with the bill. I realize that there are other senators that do care to make additions to the budget but there are still some remnants of Governor Kerrey's vetoes of the budget still there. It isn't completely, his actions to reduce the size of the budget haven't been completely undone. So I think it is probably a good idea to move on now and take a look at other bills that are before us. I don't have any bills that are going to be considered by the Legislature in the remaining three days. All of my bills are taken care of, but I do realize that a number of you do have some bills coming up that do have to be considered today and tonight. Also we have a few other items on the agenda that are going to be taken up before we adjourn at midnight. Some of those are the sales and income tax increases as well as the salaries of the constitutional officers, both might be controversial, both might take a number of hours to discuss and then we do have a few other bills that are on Final Reading that are going to have to be taken back, possibly with amendments. I can think of the telephone bill, possibly the caboose bill, there is a whole list of bills here that we are going to have to deal with. I think we have had a pretty good discussion of them and I can't see where the votes are going to be here for any more overrides, it is going to require 30 votes and I just don't think the votes are going to be here. So I urge the body to advance this bill and we can get on to other matters. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I'm going to support Senator DeCamp's motion to send LB 1251 back thereby not allowing any further attempts to override vetoes that provisions contained within LB 1251. When we have but three days left in the legislative session and we still have to set tax rates and make appropriate adjustments, it seems to me that it is probably best that we lay to rest at least the
