

rules and terminate effectively any more veto overrides only on LB 1251. It doesn't go to any of the other issues mentioned. And my thought was, let's get this one cleared up, then get on to the next one. In other words, I am convinced we have pretty well laid the course for a half cent sales tax increase. We have spent the additional money. As I said earlier, I think not too wisely, but very, very well, and I thought maybe it was time to terminate it. However, I am sure Senator Chambers would like to override the advocacy agencies, and I suspect he can get it done, and I guess my comment would be, what the heck, we have done about 20 or 21 million, what is another couple of hundred thousand. My other goal was, as I say, to give serious consideration maybe if we did this than to getting the sales tax bill done and advanced and on Final, returned here, and then to adjourn for the day, instead of taking up 35 or 40 motions on all the other bills, because I have looked through them and I guess I can't see anything that anybody can't live without between now and next year. A lot of them are completely new bills and everything, and I still think that might be the most sensible thing. However, old John works best in two conditions in here. Senator Schmit said or Senator Ernie said I worked good in chaos, I think. That is condition number one. Well, maybe Schmit or somebody. Lamb, Lamb, Lamb accuses me. Chaos is my preferred condition. However, there is an even more important one and that is absolutely smooth waters, when you have the really important things, and this is a smooth water situation, this last two and a half days, and I can see that if I succeeded on this, and I think there probably are 30 votes to do it, but I can see that if I were to succeed, we would have one choppy black sailor in here making lots of waves. Therefore, I am more concerned about getting smooth waters and so I would withdraw the motion and suggest, suggest that we do the tax bill and then seriously consider going...adjourning for the day. So I will withdraw it.
