

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Question.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Debate has ceased. Senator Landis...no. Okay, the question is the adoption of the Landis amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 8 nays on adoption of Senator Landis's amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Landis amendment is adopted. Do you have anything else on it?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Pappas would move to amend the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Pappas, please.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Is that the July 17th?

CLERK: Sunset to July 17, yes, sir.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Okay, Mr. President, colleagues, Vard is sitting here shaking his head but it's wrong. I have talked to different people back in my district. I think basically a lot of people have looked at this as an increase for six months and not a total continuation and what this will do is sunset it July 17th, '87 which will be in place for six months. I would ask for the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I had several lights on and I failed to...Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Well, just briefly, Mr. President, I rise to oppose the amendment. All I would say is that you have built in a continuation budget that assumes this level of revenue. If you have the tax to be discontinued in six months, you will find yourselves in the next session identically where you are now except it will be more difficult and a worse problem. I'd urge that the amendment be rejected.
