

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Question. Is that too obvious?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vard Johnson, would you like to close on advancing the bill.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I'd rather have somebody who is more in favor of it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, I'll move to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor...a machine vote has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance LB 539.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 539 is advanced. LB 31.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 31 is on Select File. I have several amendments pending. The first amendment I have...the E & R amendments have been adopted, Mr. President, as of last year. There was an amendment by Senator Labeledz to the bill last year that was adopted. Senator Warner, I have amendments from you, Senator. Senator, this is your amendment on the intergovernmental data communications. Okay. Senator Warner wishes to withdraw that amendment, Mr. President. The next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Vard Johnson. Senator, this is the amendment that was printed on page 1905 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I think this is one to pull. I'm going to
