CLERK: Mr. President, the next bill for consideration is LB 43. The bill has been on Select File. The E & R amendments have been adopted. Mr. President, the first motion I have on the bill is by Senators Nelson and Remmers. You want to offer that, Senator?

PRESIDENT: Do you wish to pursue your amendment, Senators Nelson and Remmers?

SENATOR NELSON: Yes. Is that the one 59,000 that was filed some time ago?

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR NELSON: I think there are some superseding amendment filed there, isn't there?

CLERK: There is.

SENATOR NELSON: I believe we'll withdraw that. Right, Senator Remmers? Go with the other one.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator Landis, I understand you want to withdraw your amendment, Senator. That was on page 1924.

SENATOR LANDIS: That one I'll withdraw.

CLERK: Okay. Mr. President, Senator Landis would move to amend the bill. Senator Landis's amendment is on page 2064 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, this is the last night, the last chance to raise the constitutional officers salaries for the next four years. By the basis of a survey it seems to me the best chance to get a salary increase is to set the Governor's salary at 58,000, the Attorney General at 57,500, the Lieutenant Governor and the Secretary of State at 40,000, and 45,000 for the State Treasurer, Auditor of Public Accounts and the Public Service Commissioners. For those of you who support the bill I'd ask that you simply respond by voting and not necessarily debate the issue. There are a couple of people who want to
