LB 300

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes.

PRESIDENT: What do we have on LB 300, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the E & R amendments have been adopted. The first amendment I have to the bill is by Senators Schmit and Rupp. Senator, this is AM2921.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

CLERK: I think this one maybe goes away, Senator.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I think you can throw it away, yes. AM3017 is the one that I'm looking for.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the body, I would like to ask your indulgence. First, I will move to suspend the rules because what we are doing here is to strip LB 300 and insert the contents of another bill. The purpose of this bill is to extend, by one year, the effective time of the Midwest Marketing Compact we adopted last year. Two other states have adopted the same compact. One, Iowa, assured me Friday they probably would adopt it. So, therefore, to be in compliance with those other states we need to adopt this date change. I move we suspend the rules at this time.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion? Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I totally support what Senator Schmit wants to do. I think he's done an excellent job with the Midwest Compact. I am proud to have been one of the early sponsors...one of the early voters on the Midwest Compact. This little change is a very important change to ultimately put together a fine grain marketing compact for our states.

PRESIDENT: Further discussion? Any closing, Senator Schmit? Closing, Senator Schmit?
