LB 355A

SENATOR GOLL: Mr. Chairman, Mr. President, sir, I move the adoption of the amendment which merely delays the implementation date of LB 355A. I move...

PRESIDENT: You move that it be adopted, Senator. Any discussion? Motion is the adoption of the amendment offered by Senator Goll. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote on the motion to adopt the amendment. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Goll.

SENATOR GOLL: Mr. President, I move to advance the bill to E & R.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to readvance the bill to Enrollment and Review. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The bill is readvanced. All right, we move to LB 921. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, I guess I don't understand why we aren't going down the order in the green sheet.

PRESIDENT: Because these are special bills, well, they are not special bills, but these are bills that the Speaker asked to be worked on because they have do or die amendments, I guess.

SENATOR LAMB: Just sort of an arbitrary thing, is that it?

PRESIDENT: Do you want to answer that, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes.

SENATOR LAMB: Arbitrary?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes. It certainly is.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, I guess I should think when we got back to these bills, we would go right down the green sheet, the agenda, which is up for tomorrow and take those bills in the order that they are on the green sheet agenda. I guess I don't understand the reason for the arbitrary white list which doesn't seem to
