PRESIDENT: We are back on the agenda again. We credit you with being single-minded, Senator Lamb. The Clerk advises that the motion is proper. We will have to vote on it. Senator Lamb has moved to adjourn until eight-thirty in the morning. Motion is withdrawn. We are back on...are we on LB 921 yet. Resume, Mr. Clerk, where were we?

CLERK: Mr. President, first of all on 921, Senator Wesely, you had amendments printed on 2092. Are they going to be withdrawn, Senator?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes.

CLERK: Mr. President, then the next motion I have is a motion by Senator Wesely to return the bill for a specific amendment. Senator, I have AM3054 in front of me.

SENATOR WESELY: Correct. Yes, that is the one I need. Thank you and I will be very brief again. LB 921 deals with the question of ICF licensure under the Health Department. There is another bill, LB924, with similar provisions. What has happened is we have worked out an agreement with the representatives of NebARC, the Health Department, the representatives of Martin Luther Home, Bethphage. We have sat down with the nurses, the Nursing Association, and all those amendments have been incorporated into the amendment being offered by Senator Smith and myself. They incorporate parts of 924 into 921, and what it basically does is clarify the problem with ICF nursing standards, and the problem that we have had up with that, plus it identifies ICF-MR standards and how those will be applied.
