SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Marsh, did you have...did you wish to speak?

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I feel personally obligated to be gone this noon. I share the view of Senator Warner and I would, personally, like to have the body reconvene so that there is an audience for the reading. So I would not be in favor of the recommended change.
