SENATOR WARNER: Well, there is so many not voting, Mr. President, I'd ask for a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Very well. Since we are on Final Reading, may I ask that all members check in, please. Under the rules you should be at your station. A roll call has been requested. Senator Warner, do you want to record your presence. Senator Schmit, Senator Lynch, Senator Hefner, Senator Vickers, Senator Pirsch, Senator Labedz, Senator Goll, Senator Chronister. Senator Vickers, Senator Pirsch, Senator Labedz, Senator Chronister and Senator Schmit. Senator Warner, do you wish to pursue this without a call of the house to get others here? Very well. The Clerk will call the roll and the motion is to return the bill to Select File to strike the enacting clause.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on pages 2370-71 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Is there something else on the bill?

CLERK: No, sir, I have nothing further on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Read the bill then?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT: We will proceed with the reading of LB 122.

CLERK: (Read LB 122 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 122 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote on LB 122 if you wish to vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on pages 2371-72 of the Legislative Journal.) 32 ayes, 14 nays, 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A majority of the members having voted in the affirmative, the bill is declared passed. We proceed with the
