ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1172 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1172 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote aye or nay on the final passage of 1172. Have you all voted? Have you all voted on final passage of 1172? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on pages 2376-77 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 26 nays, Mr. President, on passage of the bill.

PRESIDENT: LB 1172 fails to pass. We skip then 1172A and proceed to LB 90.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have some motions on LB 90. Senator DeCamp, I understand you are going to withdraw yours, Senator. Mr. President, the first motion I have...Senator Hall, you had one you had given me earlier, Senator, on page 2161.

SENATOR HALL: I will withdraw that one.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion from Senator Scofield to suspend the rules and vote without further amendment on debate on the bill. I don't know if you want to take that up, Senator.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to pursue that motion, Senator Scofield?

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Are there other amendments?

PRESIDENT: Your motion to suspend the rules and proceed.

CLERK: I have...Senator Hall, you had amendments on 2217, Senator. I understand you want to withdraw those.
