PRESIDENT: Yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I move that we suspend the rules and handle all of the resolutions that you have on a special page, with the exception of LR 437. Following the passage or the acceptance of all the resolutions, except 437, we'll take it following this. So my motion is to suspend the rules and vote on them all in one vote, with the exception of 437.

PRESIDENT: I understand, Mr. Speaker, that LR 442 at the very last is not included either.

SPEAKER NICHOL: It wasn't? I didn't know that there was an objection to that. But if there is,...

PRESIDENT: It's listed separately on the agenda. I thought maybe it was not included in the mass.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Well, you might check to see if there is an objection. If not, why I see no reason why we can't.

PRESIDENT: No, I guess it's included. All resolutions, with the exception of LR 437, are included in this motion. Is there discussion on the motion to suspend the rules? If not, the motion is to suspend the rules for the purpose stated. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the motion to suspend the rules and to adopt those resolutions as identified on the handout on your desks.

PRESIDENT: That leaves with us LR 437. We will do that and other resolutions later.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have one item to read in and that is the Executive Board will have a meeting today at twelve o'clock in Room 2102, Exec Board at noon in 2102.

Mr. President, the next motion I have is a motion by the Speaker to suspend the rules so we can proceed with the Final Reading of bills bracketed for April 17. That motion is offered by the Speaker.

PRESIDENT: That is the motion by the Speaker, to suspend the rules to read Final Reading of the bills bracketed for 4-17. Is
