

are concerned about the absence of members during Final Reading. I can only refer you to your own rules that members are required to be in their seats during Final Reading and the less movement out of the Chamber during Final Reading, the better appearance our liturgy and sanctity of Final Reading will be. Next the Clerk will read LB 965.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 965 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 965 pass? All those in favor aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2435 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 44 ayes, 4 nays, 1 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A majority of members having voted in the affirmative, LB 965 is declared passed. The Clerk will now read LB 967 with the emergency clause.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 967 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 967 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2436 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 48 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT: A sufficient majority having voted in the affirmative, LB 967 is declared passed with the emergency clause attached. The Clerk will read LB 999.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp would move to return the bill for a specific amendment. (Senator DeCamp's amendment appears on page 2436 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I shall be relatively brief. I did want to make a few observations before you go for the final vote on this bill. LB 999, as Senator Rod Johnson correctly
