PRESIDENT: Very well. Members will please record your presence on the green board. A roll call vote has been requested. Please check in. Senators Warner and Schmit and Lynch and Hannibal and Morehead and Smith. Senator DeCamp. All members in the Chamber, please check in.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, in the meantime though I would accept call in votes.

PRESIDENT: Well, do you want to...you have requested a roll call, do you want to withdraw that?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Unless somebody wants to call in a vote, that is all right with me. We can save some time.

PRESIDENT: There has been a multiple request for a roll call, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: That's all right, let's have a roll call then.

PRESIDENT: I believe that one senator is excused and all the rest are present. So the Clerk will proceed with the roll call on final passage of LB 603.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2445-46 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President. (Journal shows 4 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting.)

PRESIDENT: A majority of the membership having voted in the affirmative, the bill, LB 603, is declared passed. We will proceed now...we will let the Clerk read items into the record. Before that, Mr. Clerk, let me announce that Senator Smith has guests. Well, I don't know where they are.
