

consensus, the majority view, and that I, too, support, even though I may have had other preferences had they been available. The reduced in revenue, as I pointed out earlier, is covered by at least a 4 percent reserve which will certainly handle a 12 or \$13 million, \$33 million in reserve. That will certainly handle a substantial shortfall should we experience that, and we can't have it repeat as far as money available next time, but the transfer to the cash flow reserve is required by 870 and if the shortfall occurs, then there is no additional revenue as a result of this tax. Most important is the option is there to take out the funding for the things that...and I do not need to recite them again, but the option is there yet today to take all of those out. Well, you don't have to take quite all of them out, but as Senator Hannibal...well, you have to take everything out but about 4.8 or 5 million, but as Senator Hannibal has pointed out, even if you do that with the 3 percent reserve, and if the 12 million, you're down to 1 1/2 and the odds are so good that you're going to be back but you can't possibly...

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR WARNER: ...justify any other vote than the one that we can now make, I'd urge that LB 539 become law notwithstanding the objection of the Governor.

PRESIDENT: The motion then of Senator Warner is to vote to override the Governor's veto and the question is, shall LB 539 pass notwithstanding the veto of the Governor? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted on the Warner motion? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 2450 of the Legislative Journal.) 33 ayes, 13 nays, 2 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting, Mr. President, on the motion to override the veto.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and the veto is overridden. Do you have another motion?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, the next motion I have with respect to the veto overrides is that by the Appropriations Committee. The Appropriations Committee would move that LB 1252 become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.
