

to vote on this thing. But I think that you ought to recognize that unless you put some bucks in there, next year I'm going to come in here and introduce the bill to wipe out the whole blooming thing. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: You have about three minutes left, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, the issue is simple. By the way, it is not whether the Governor wins. It is whether soil and water conservation wins. That is the issue and the only issue before you. I still strongly believe that the political process of elections and four years, eight years at most is what you have for water plans. We know it takes longer than that. We know that you have elected people serving now through the local NRDs up to the Natural Resource Commission. They used to have muscle. Senator Landis indicates that you need muscle to get moving. All I ask you is what direction has soil and water conservation moved the last year? It has moved backwards. That is the wrong way to move. Return what had worked so successfully for many years, vote to override 778.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to override LB 778. The question is, shall LB 778 pass notwithstanding the objections of the Governor? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote on the motion before us. Please record your vote, if you wish to vote, aye or nay. Have you all voted? Senator Warner, it looks like we're not getting very far.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I'd respectfully request, if we are not under call, a call of the house and roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Call of the house has been requested. The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. Now we are under call and we ask you, again, to record your presence. Senator Schmit and Senator Lamb. Senator Labeledz and Senator McFarland. I believe we are all here who are not excused. Senator Lynch. Senator Lynch. Roll call vote has been requested. Clerk, call the roll, aye or nay.
