

yourself with the lawyers out there, Ed Perry and Bob Gruit, and I think they will satisfy you. I suggest we just leave the bill in the form that it is in and be done with this.

PRESIDENT: At this time we have the substitute amendment. Sorry, misinformed. Senator Lamb, do you wish to speak at this time? We have the DeCamp amendment before us, Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members, we've had a lot of argument about this issue, first in the Reference Committee, then at the committee hearing, now probably on the floor. It is very difficult for those of us who are laymen, are not lawyers, to sort through it and see exactly what we are talking about, what is the issue, and is there merit to the argument on both sides, should there be more restrictive language in the bill or should there not. As I understand Senator DeCamp said at the hearing and other times that to have the exact language, the release language in the bill would be satisfactory to him rather than the other, more restrictive language that he has proposed. I also understand that Senator Beutler and others really do not have any objection to including the actual release language in the bill, except that they are saying it is not necessary, it is not necessary. Well, now I don't know whether it is necessary or not, but it seems to me that it is a simple, straightforward way to resolve the issue here. Just put it in. It doesn't hurt anything. As Senator Schmit often says, it is easy to pass a bill that doesn't do anything, doesn't hurt anybody and doesn't cost anything. So maybe we have a situation here where the whole thing can be resolved. If Senator DeCamp or Senator Beutler have the amendment drafted which merely puts the release language in there, I'd support it, and I think the whole body should support it. Let's do it. Let's be done with it.
