PRESIDENT: Do you have something to finish? You are extending now into your next five minutes. You were next on the list after Haberman.

SENATOR DECAMP: Oh.

PRESIDENT: Okay?

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, whatever. So, Mr. President, I would urge the body to once and for all get cleared up the question of any legal exposure, either pay nothing and let the Commonwealth people try to get 60 million, 50, whatever they can get through the courts and through a finding that we are either guilty or not guilty, or if we are paying out money for settlement, then let it be settled and let it be over from the legal exposure standpoint. Despite the fact that the Lincoln media want to keep saying we are legally liable, as I say the courts, the special committee and by adoption of the amendment the Legislature would say we are not legally liable and we are settling it for this amount in case there is any question.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, I understand your substitute is here if you want to talk directly on it.

CLERK: Senator, I have other amendments ahead of the substitute.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay. If anybody objects to substituting,...
