

to anybody now. It is costing us around \$35,000. Our budget is just as tight as everybody else's, so my amendment says that the interest, as long as the money doesn't belong to anybody and is in limbo, the interest reverts, goes back to the Legislative Council. That is my amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The speakers that I have on the list, this was before the Haberman amendment came up, are Warner, did you wish to speak on the Haberman amendment? Senator Warner. Your name was on the other list, Senator Warner. I don't have a new list without buttons, so. You don't have to speak on it if you don't want to.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I hadn't intended to. But I would...it is one of these times I would almost hope Senator Haberman would withdraw it. It seems to me we've got enough problems out of this whole situation not to suggest some approach such as this. I would...if it is pursued I would hope it would be unanimously opposed. But, it would even be better judgement if it was withdrawn.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman, did you...

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. Speaker, I just found out my amendment really doesn't do that, so I will withdraw it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You wish to withdraw it? All right, it is withdrawn. Do you have any other amendments that wish to be taken up at this time, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the bill at this point.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp, did you wish to advance the bill from General File?

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, with the clear understanding that it is only a convenience and I am still waiting to put in complete clearing of legal liability language, somehow.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You may do that on Select File, of course.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, sir, and with notice to everybody that that is what I am going to attempt.
