

not of the same category or variety as the subject matter of the bill. We have done it before. As a matter of fact, bills have been passed by the Legislature that consisted of nothing but repealers. That's all. And it repealed everything from washing sheep or whatever that was to other things. So, there are ways of getting things done that are very painless and not expensive and this is one of those ways. I even had a bill that, this was years ago when Governor Exon was the Governor, Senator Exon now was the Governor, and it would have required some due process rights for those taking the bar exam. I had a bill that would require the court to allow a person who flunked the exam to see the exam and know what questions had not been passed to appeal that failure and then to require the publication of the questions. The court got to Exon and he vetoed the bill. Now the bill was...no, he couldn't veto it, there was an amendment, I think, that was added to Senator Luedtke's bill that had nothing to do with the one that was to be repealed and that bill was carrying a repealer of another statute that had nothing to do with the subject matter of the bill carrying it and it was constitutional. So there is nothing unconstitutional about using this bill to repeal LB 496. If you pass LB 1, you're doing a service to 6,000 people, their friends and sympathizers. If you pass my amendment, you'll be doing a benefit to 350,000 citizens scattered throughout this state. So I hope you will add this amendment to LB 1.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President, I object on the grounds of Rule 7, subsection (d), germaneness issue.

PRESIDENT: Further discussion on the point of order? Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: (No response.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, based on the discussion I just gave it is clear that germaneness is not the basis on which to attack this if you're going to attack it at all. Just last session, to show what germaneness means when we deal with bills, Senator Labeledz took an A bill that retained its designation as A,
