

stripped everything out of it and named a park after Senator Eugene Mahoney. Now, that was nothing. That had nothing in common with an A bill. But the Supreme Court has said that the Legislature can take a bill and strip everything out of it, leaving only the number and put anything in it that it wants to. The same thing has been found with reference to repealers. A repealer need not have anything whatsoever to do with the bill to which it is attached and that has been done by the Legislature repeatedly. And even Senator Beutler, I think, maybe he doesn't know of any examples, so I won't put that on him, but there are senators in here who know that such things have been done because they may have participated in the doing of it. So, Mr. Speaker, Mr. Chairman, I am arguing that germaneness has nothing to do with this issue at all. It is a legitimate legislative prerogative to use a bill to carry a repealer of another bill or statute which has nothing whatsoever to do with the substance of the bill that is carrying the repealer. So I am asking that the Chair not sustain Senator Morehead's suggestion that this amendment is out of order as being not germane. Germaneness is not the issue.

PRESIDENT: Senator Morehead.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President, I don't know if it's proper to bring up more than one issue at a time, but if...I additionally feel that it is not germane, but I also feel that it is not within the confines of the call of this special session. Now if I need to separate the two objections, I will, but I do think that two of them apply and especially the second one which I have just mentioned. Thirdly, I'd like to quote Senator Chambers. About two seconds ago he says, I don't want to hinder the orderly or disorderly movement of this bill and I would object as...for a direct quote from him, too, if that is his true intent in the movement of this bill, but I do think it is without the call of the special session.
