PRESIDENT: The Chair will overrule the point of order. Because of the fact that the Chair required all members to be in your seats, you had full opportunity, as I did, to follow the Clerk in the reading of the bill.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, then I understand your overruling my point of order and after the point was raised, I did begin following the Clerk and I will say you are far more talented than I am being able to listen, because I couldn't hear the individual words of what it said.

PRESIDENT: The Chair will refrain from editorializing about this matter as he tried to do at one time. The request now is for the Clerk to call the roll in reverse order. May I first allow my usual statement. All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is now, shall LB 1 pass with the emergency clause attached? The Clerk will call the roll in reverse order.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on pages 73-74 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 10 nays, 1 present and not voting, 4 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 1 is declared passed with the emergency clause attached. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LB 1. Mr. Clerk. Can I have a Page, please? The Clerk will now read new resolutions being introduced today.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a new resolution, LR 2, offered by Senators DeCamp and Rod Johnson. (Read LR 2 as found on pages 74-75 of the Legislative Journal.) Mr. President, in order to consider that today there is a motion to suspend Rule 4, Section 6, so as to consider LR 2 today.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, do you wish to take this? Yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, for myself I don't care what kind of resolutions or anything else are considered, but in view of the way I was dealt with the other day on a proposition, I want to know whether any of these resolutions, LR 1, or LR 2, or any subsequent resolution
