

PRESIDENT: Who is next? Anyone else who wishes to speak on the motion to suspend the rules? All right, then we are about to take up the motion to suspend the rules in order to discuss the legislative resolution offered by Senator Nelson. The approval on this will require 30 votes but we will try a voice vote first unless there is objection. All those in favor of taking up the resolution say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The rules are suspended. We will now proceed to read the resolution. The resolution has been read. The Chair recognizes Senator Nelson to explain the exact resolution.

SENATOR NELSON: Mr. President, members of the body, is it necessary to read the resolution back? No. All right, I think I have explained and I have mentioned, most of you know that they had two very severe earthquakes and the death toll has been all the way we have heard from 3,000 to 11,000 people. And in any terms this is a terrible lot of people and a lot of homes are destroyed, business, industry. Some of these families will never recover even though they did not lose someone personally. Also, the earthquake did severe damage to a metropolitan city and we all know what that does to our cities and as I mentioned like to the City of Omaha. The Mexican people, I think, are very bold and they have tried to handle this themselves. They have dug through the debris and have hunted for bodies and have taken...I relate this back to my tornado in Grand Island, Nebraska, you just do not know what people can do when they have to and a situation such as this arises. As all my resolution does is, lets the people know of Nebraska...of Mexico that we are concerned and we do feel sorry for them, truly sorry for them.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on Senator Nelson's resolution? If not, all those in favor of adopting the resolution offered by Senator Nelson vote aye, opposed vote nay. The Clerk will call the roll. May we have order, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken.) 41 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution. (See page 75 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The resolution is declared adopted and passed. A motion has been made to adjourn sine die by Senator Morehead. The motion is nondebatable. If we would not
