SENATOR LUNDY: Mr. President, I move that a committee of five be appointed to wait upon the Governor to advise him that the Legislature has completed its work and is ready to adjourn and to ask if he has any further message for the Legislature.

PRESIDENT: Very well. The motion is to appoint an escort committee. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: I would like to ask Speaker Nichol or whoever would be in a position to tell me, are we going to take up any other resolutions, specifically LR 1, I believe it is? What is the plan on that?

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, as far as I know we will not take up any other resolutions. The Executive Board will not go into session further on the resolution that you are speaking of. And as far as I know this will conclude the businesses as far as this legislative session is concerned.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: So then the only business is bringing the Governor in?

PRESIDENT: That is the only thing we apparently have on the desk, Senator.
