Ladies and gentlemen in the middle aisle, (gavel) I would like to announce this so that most of you hear it and don't get mixed up. Tomorrow morning, nine o'clock, Friday, nine o'clock; Saturday morning, eight-thirty, some of you have meetings that you want to get off to and the ball game starts early or some darn thing, I don't know what it is, but, anyway, nine o'clock tomorrow, eight-thirty Saturday morning. Both meetings should be short, all three meetings, today, tomorrow, and Saturday morning, and all the bills should be entered by the time we adjourn Saturday which should be considerably before noon, if all of the bills that are being worked on are in by that time. So nine o'clock tomorrow, eight-thirty Saturday. The following week we will be off for the Appropriations Committee and the Revenue Committee to have meetings and hearings as they desire. We will go back to work on Monday, the 28th of October, work Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and I believe at this time we will take off that Friday for the purpose of if any of you committee chairmen have hearings scheduled after the 30th of October, you should be thinking about whether or not you wish to cancel those hearings or have them on that Friday, which is November 1st. Is that Friday, November 1st? If you wish to have hearings, that would be a good time to hear them, but if you do have committee hearings scheduled anywhere in the state or in Lincoln after the 30th of October, you should be seriously thinking about what you want to do about it. So at the time being nine o'clock tomorrow, eight-thirty Saturday, off all next week, come back the following Monday and we will go to work. Any questions? Well, I am glad I made it that clear, if you all understand it. Mr. Clerk, do you have other things to read in? And once again, if you have bills that you are working on that you wish to get in today, please let me know now. Mr. Clerk.
