SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. You have heard the motion. Is there any further discussion? All those in favor of suspending the rules please vote aye, opposed nay. Senator DeCamp, would you push my button back there, please. Thank you, Shirley. We need 30 votes on this, ladies and gentlemen. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to suspend rules, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The rules are suspended. Would you please direct your attention to Senator Abboud while he tells you a few words about this fine gentleman.

SENATOR ABOUD: Mr. President, I realize we're under a limited time constraint today, so I would just move that LR 1 be adopted by the body.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. Any further discussion? The question is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Lundy, would you help me out there, please. I want you to push my green button. Thank you. I'm disconnected from here. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The resolution is adopted. Mr. Clerk, do we have any new bills entered today?
